

Vote by Mail Information

Absentee Ballots are for registered voters who are not able to vote in person at the polling place because they will be absent from the municipality due to illness, work, school or a disability.

Mail-in Ballots are for registered voters who are not eligible to apply for an absentee ballot but would like to vote by mail rather than in person at a polling place.

A voter may apply for an absentee or mail-in ballot in the following ways:

- Print out and complete an absentee or mail-in ballot application and send the completed form to the Union County Elections Office, 155 N. 15th Street, Lewisburg, PA 17837
- Apply in person at Union County Elections Office, 155 N. 15th Street, Lewisburg. Business hours - Monday-Friday, 8:00am - 4:30pm
- Call the Union County Elections Office at 570-524-8681

The last day to apply for an absentee or mail-in-ballot is Tuesday, May, 11, 2021. Applications must be delivered by hand or by U.S. mail to the Union County Elections Office before 5:00pm. Emailed or faxed applications will not be accepted. Postmarks do not count.

The deadline for the Elections Office to receive voted absentee or mail-in in ballots is Tuesday, May 18 at 8pm.

Active-duty military and their dependents and civilians residing overseas may apply for absentee ballots using different forms and deadlines. Contact Elections Office at 570-524-8681.

A voter who applies for an absentee or mail-in-ballot may only vote at a polling place on Election Day by Provisional Ballot, **UNLESS** the voter brings their official ballot and official return envelope to the polling place. The surrendered ballot and envelope will be marked void and the voter may then vote on the voting machine.
